- Names: Bible, Sacred Scriptures, Sacred or Holy Book, the Word of God, the Old & New Testaments





Differences

- Deuterocanonicals
 - The 7 books not in the Protestant canon
 - Second listing
 - Accepted by Catholics as inspired
 - Included in the Septuagint





Explanation for Differences by non-Catholics:

- Council of Jamnia (90-95 A.D)
 - After destruction of Jerusalem & the temple
 - Discussion concerned how can the Jewish people restructure completely their religious lives.
- Council of Trent held in three parts from 1545 to 1563.
 - added 7 books





What is the Council of Jamnia?

- Meeting of Jewish leaders in 90AD
 - Reset the Jewish canon of Scripture
 - Included only Hebrew written books
 - Trying to get away from Jewish-Christian views
- Martin Luther, when he broke away from the Catholic Church (1517), followed this canon with 39 books.





Jamnia Criteria

- Conformity with the Pentateuch (first 5 books)
- Written in Hebrew
- Written in Palestine Israel
- Written before 400 B.C





Jamnia Criteria

- Baruch: not written in Palestine;
- Sirach & 1 Maccabees: written after 400 BC
- Tobit & parts of Daniel & Ester: In Aramaic written outside Palestine;
- Judith: Aramaic
- Wisdom: Greek
- 2 Maccabees: written after 400B.C & in Greek


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- 2 Maccabees: written after 400B.C & in Greek




The 'Council' of Jamnia



- The school at Jamnia became a "substitute" Sanhedrin after the sack of Jerusalem
- There was no 'council' as such. Councils in this sense were a Christian concept.
- Jamnia declared that only Hebrew scrolls should be used in synagogues, and rejected the LXX.
- Jamnia also introduced a curse on the Christians into the Jewish liturgy
- Jamnia is popularly thought to have produced a closed "Palestinian canon"





The Septuagint

- From the word 'septa' meaning 70
- Also known as the LXX
- 70 scholars translated the Hebrew Bible to Greek, the common language at that time
- It is the Hebrew Scripture in the time of Jesus
- There are 300 quotes of the NT from the Septuagint
- It contains the 46 books.





The Councils of the Church

- It was the councils of the Catholic Church that determined the canon of Scripture
 - Council of Rome (382)
 - Synod of Hippo (393)
 - Council of Carthage (397)
- The main purpose of canonization of Scripture is to determine what the Church will read in the liturgy

THE COMPILATION PROCESS OF THE CHRISTIAN BIBLE

COLLECTION / SELECTION

150 AD - 340 AD







Out of more than 300 books collected only 27 were selected as part of the New Testament. Books that were rejected are: Gospel of Thomas, Acts of Paul, Gospel of James, Gospel of Peter, Gospel of Philip, Gospel of Mary, Gospel of Judas, Acts of Peter, Acts of Andrew, etc.

CANONIZATION

393 AD - 397 AD







Church Councils of Hippo and Carthage finally declared 73-books to composed the Bible. It consists of 27 books New Testament and 46 books Old Testament, The Old Testament canon was based to the Greek Septuagint version that contained Deuterocanonical books.

TRANSLATION

405 AD









St. Jerome through the order of Pope Damasus translated the first complete Christian Bible into Latin Dialect. The Latina Vulgata Bible was the source of God's Word for more than 1,000 years before some English Versions were released for English speaking Christians.

VERSE & CHAPTER

1230 AD - 1490 AD









Catholic Bishops Langton & Santo Caro divided the Books by Chapters. While Santes Pagnino divided the Chapters into verses. This numbering is for convenience in memorizing biblical passages.

THE BIBLE IS A CATHOLIC BOOK & AND IT ONLY EXISTED UNTIL 4TH CENTURY



Council of Carthage (397)

- 16 It was also determined that besides the Canonical Scriptures nothing be read in the Church under the title of divine Scriptures. The Canonical Scriptures are these: Genesis, Exodus, Leviticus, Numbers, Deuteronomy, Joshua the son of Nun, Judges, Ruth, four books of Kings, two books of Paraleipomena, Job, the Psalter, five books of Solomon, the books of the twelve prophets, Isaiah, Jeremiah, Ezechiel, Daniel, Tobit, Judith, Esther, two books of Esdras, two Books of the Maccabees.
- 17 Of the New Testament: four books of the Gospels, one book of the Acts of the Apostles, thirteen Epistles of the Apostle Paul, one epistle of the same [writer] to the Hebrews, two Epistles of the Apostle Peter, three of John, one of James, one of Jude, one book of the Apocalypse of John.
- 18 So let the church over the sea be consulted to confirm this canon. Let it also be allowed that the Passions of Martyrs be read when their festivals are kept.
- 20 Let this be made known also to our brother and fellow-priest Boniface, or to other bishops of those parts, for the purpose of confirming that Canon. Because we have received from our fathers that those books must be read in the Church.
- 5 books of Solomon: Proverbs, Ecclesiastes, Song of Songs, Wisdom of Solomon, and Ecclesiasticus (Sirach).





The Reformation

- In 1517, Martin Luther started the reformation with his 95 theses and started the Protestant movement
- The prevailing theology is Sola Fide and Sola Scriptura
- He changed the canon of scripture following the Jewish canon of 39 books of the OT
- He also tried to remove the NT books of Hebrews, James, Jude and Revelation






Post-Reformation

- The Council of Trent (1545-1563) was called as a counter-reformation
- It affirmed the canon of scripture 46 OT and 27 NT
- The Dead Sea Scrolls were found in Qumran in 1947
- The Hebrew version of some of the Deuterocanonical books were found


